A mailing containing Check-In information, including the location and a map, will be sent near the **end of August**. If you plan to be away from your primary residence during late August, please email <u>participantinfo@thehenryford.org</u> and indicate the best mailing address to send pertinent car show information t. Also included in the mailed packet will be your vehicle dash card(s), historic parking zone assignment, and other important pertinent information, including:

• Vehicle Dash Card (DISPLAY FOR THE EVENT WEEKEND)

Unique to you and your historic vehicle, your dash card provides important information (generated directly from registration details you provided) for our parking crew, narrators, and guests. <u>Following</u> <u>onsite check-in, it is important to immediately place the card in a visible location on your</u> <u>vehicle and leave it in place at all times while inside the Village.</u> (Note: reprints are available at the information booth in front of Town Hall on Saturday morning.)

• Historic Parking Zone Placard (DISPLAY AFTER CHECK-IN TO PARKING LOCATION)

The historic parking zone assignment will be printed on a designated colored sheet and is specific to your vehicle(s) year. After check-in, place the colored zone placard on the dashboard of your participating historic vehicle(s) to allow our parking attendants to direct you to your parking location inside the Village.

Onsite Check-In Procedure & Credentials

All participants in the Old Car Festival program <u>must</u> pick up their packet at Check-In. Stop *FIRST* at Check-In and pick up your participant packet. Walk-up registrations will not be considered. If you have not received communication by email after submitting an online application, your application may not be in the system.

> <u>Check-In Procedures</u>

New for 2025 We have eliminated registration timeslots. All accepted participants are free to arrive at any point within the registration hours below to check in:

Thursday, September 4, 2025 – 4:00 pm – 7:00 pm *Designated for packet pick-up ONLY; all check-in located at Lot A Thursday only* Friday, September 5, 2025 – 4:00 pm – 8:00 pm

Saturday, September 6, 2025 - 7:00 am - 11:00 am

If you are unable to arrive during the check-in hours listed above, please be sure to either call or e-mail the Registration Team at 313-982-6058 or email: <u>ParticipantInfo@thehenryford.org</u>. Sunday arrivals require special accommodation.

Credentials

At check-in, each accepted participant receives a credential packet containing the following items:

- Participant Wristbands These are your credentials for the weekend. They identify you as a
 participant, allowing you admittance to the Village and Museum for this weekend only. Your wristband
 must be securely worn on your wrist for the duration of the weekend.
 - Participants receive four wristbands per single accepted application. If you have multiple entries, you will receive four wristbands for the first entry, and one for each additional entry for up to six wristbands. There are no exceptions, and no additional wristbands will be available, so please plan accordingly. Note that wristbands are not valid for rides, movies, or the Ford Rouge Factory Tour.
 - 1 vehicle registered = 4 wristbands
 - 2 vehicles registered = 5 wristbands
 - 3 or more vehicles registered = 6 wristbands
 - Only registered participants with wristbands are permitted:
 - to enter Greenfield Village through the Village Service Road.
 - on participant shuttles.
 - to enter Greenfield Village prior to 9:30am.
 - If you wish to leave participant wristbands for guests arriving later, you may leave them in an envelope with staff at the Check-In Tent. The wristbands will then be delivered (around 9:00am) to the Will-Call window located at the front of the Greenfield Village Ticket Building, where your guests can pick them up. *Please inform your guests that they must enter Greenfield Village through the Main Village Entrance if they are not in attendance with you.*
- Popular Choice Ballot Use this to vote for your favorite vehicles at the event. (Yes, you can vote for yourself.) Extra ballots will be available at the Village front gates as well as the information booth in front of Town Hall.
- Commemorative Vehicle Dash Plaque Limit one per vehicle packet.
- ON REQUEST Participant Discounted Admission and Ride Trio Coupons may be used to
 purchase up to a TOTAL of four (4) Admission and/or Ride Trio tickets to Greenfield Village in any
 combination (Senior/Adult/Youth) at the member price (15% off). This discount applies to Greenfield
 Village admissions/rider pass and is only valid for this event weekend. Tickets for any other venue
 must be purchased separately at full admission price.

Accessing the Village after Check-In

After check-in, historic vehicles will enter Greenfield Village through the service road leading into the Village via the Blue Security Gate – look for the train tracks on your left once you enter through the Blue Security Gate. Tow/chase vehicles may enter the Village through this gate to drop off supplies and equipment and return to the modern parking lot to park. Once your vehicle is staged Friday evening/Saturday morning, please promptly move chase vehicles and/or rigs to our modern vehicle parking lot to ensure the roadways within the Village are cleared and accessible.

> Parking and Modern Vehicles

Specific parking instructions will be announced in the weeks leading up to the event.

It is preferred that you unload your modern equipment in the modern parking lot *first* and *then* drive your historic vehicle into the Village. However, if you need to bring any modern vehicles or trailers into the Village, please be aware that <u>modern vehicles of any kind are not allowed in Greenfield Village during these</u> <u>hours:</u>

- Any time on THURSDAY this has been reserved for packet pick-up only.
- Before 5:30 pm on FRIDAY
- 9:15 am 9:30 pm on SATURDAY
- 9:15 am 5:30 pm on SUNDAY

Participants wearing their wristband credentials may access the Village with their modern vehicle before opening (9:30 am) and after it closes (9:00 pm on Saturday, and 5:00 pm on Sunday). Your historic vehicle may venture in and out of Greenfield Village as needed throughout the weekend.

As the car shows have grown in popularity, our ability to accommodate overnight parking is limited. If room allows and upon request, modest-sized campers, motorhomes, and trailers will be directed to park in a modern parking lot located on our campus or within our parking plan vicinity. Please note there is no water or electrical hook-up available. Please email <u>participantinfo@thehenryford.org</u> by **August 25** if you need to arrange for overnight parking.

> Shuttle Service

For the duration of the event weekend, including the Friday night of check-in, a continuously running shuttle service will be available to all participants. You must be wearing your participant wristband to ride these shuttles. They will pick up from our modern parking lot location and drop off at the Eagle Tavern parking lot.

Please note the shuttle service will run from the check-in tent to Eagle Tavern *Friday night only.* The Museum parking lot (West Lot) adjacent to the check-in tent is reserved for guest use during the weekend. Participants must utilize the modern offsite parking during the event.

Amenities:

To rent a scooter or wheelchair, please visit the Concierge Office, located to the right of the Village Ticket Building. *Please note*: Scooters and wheelchairs cannot be reserved, and are issued on a first-come, first served basis. It is recommended that you arrive as close to 9:00am to ensure a reservation. Please contact the Village Concierge with any questions pertaining to scooter/wheelchair rentals at **313.982.6100**.

Handicap Parking is not available in the Eagle Tavern parking lot. Our shuttle services allow for easy access to and from your modern vehicle(s). At least one shuttle is **ADA compatible**. As always, guests are permitted to drive in any modern equipment to drop off guests before 9am both Saturday and Sunday.

** THANK YOU MIXER! Please join us Friday night from 6:00 pm-9:00 pm for an informal meetand-greet among fellow participants at the Lodge! Light food, beverages and music will be provided. <u>Please stop at check-in first and park your vehicle(s) in the designated area before</u> <u>attending.</u> Parking vehicles at the Lodge is prohibited and we ask that you stage your historic vehicle in your assigned parking zone first and walk over to the Lodge, and/or drop your modern vehicles off at our modern parking lot location and take the shuttle to the Mixer. Shuttles run continuously throughout the weekend.

Event Days

Please see the official program (available at check-in, at the information booth in front of Town Hall, and at the Village front gate) for additional event specific information.

- Greenfield Village is open to the public for this event from 9:30 am-9:00 pm on Saturday and 9:30 am-5:00 pm on Sunday. You are expected to display your vehicle during these times. Please refrain from tarping your vehicle while the Village is open to guests (inclement weather is an exception)
- Historic vehicles will be displayed throughout Greenfield Village in rough chronological order along the roads for guest viewing. Ramps or docks for unloading and loading are not available, nor is covered parking. Some vehicles may be used in historical vignettes.
- You may cover your vehicle overnight; however, it must be uncovered before 9:30 am the following morning, when the event opens to guests. Small (10x10), unobtrusive shade tents may be used during the show. Large tents and picnic set-ups are discouraged and may be subject to removal if deemed necessary.
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- Please note that as a multi-venue institution, there may be evening weddings or other activities taking place in Martha-Mary Chapel, Eagle Tavern, or elsewhere in the Village, in Lovett Hall, or in the Museum.

> <u>Pass-in-Review</u>

A variety of special presentations take place at the Main Stage on Main Street in Washington Boulevard. Our Pass-in-Review (times are listed in the official program) is narrated by expert automotive historians who share vehicle details, unique and innovative features, and related commentary. The activity features preselected participants that will be notified when it is time to proceed to the Main Stage with their vehicle.

> Awards and Highlighted Activities

Car Games - Will also be held on Walnut Grove. The games give you an opportunity to show off your vehicle and your driving skills. They allow our guests to see you and your car in action in a fun setting and help put the "festival" into the event. We have scheduled the games to make it easy for you to get involved. All participants receive a ribbon for playing in the Car Games. You can participate as often as you like on either or both days, but you will receive only one ribbon.

Gaslight Tour - Beginning at 7:00 pm as darkness falls, all are invited out into the streets of Greenfield Village for the Gaslight Tour. Whether it's gas, kerosene, or early electric, all are welcome.

Special Evening Entertainment with live music is presented for everyone on Saturday evening at 7:00 pm. See the official program or our website for more information about this offering, and for times and locations of other fun activities for the whole family throughout the weekend.

Vignettes of the Decades is a car show favorite! Look for special sights, sounds, and activities of decades past as we celebrate our history.

Popular Choice - Guests and vehicle owners cast their vote for their favorite vehicle by filling in the ballot using the participant number shown on the Dash Card displayed on your vehicle. One overall 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards will be presented on Sunday at approximately 4:30 pm.

Curator's Choice is awarded to the best preserved, unrestored cars. Very few vehicles have had no restoration work, and these awards allow our curators the opportunity to review vehicles that are both unrestored and unmodified from their original condition. This review has no bearing on whether a vehicle is accepted or denied participation in the event. Two Curator's Choice awards are presented on Sunday.

Vehicle Class Judging - Judges examine the authenticity of the vehicle, the workmanship of all the restoration work, and the quality of maintenance performed by the owner. Then, using a 400-point judging system, they determine a first, second, and third place winner in each of the eleven (11) judging classes. From these winners, one (1) Grand Champion is chosen on each day of the Festival.

We encourage participants to remain on campus for the duration of the event. Vehicles who have won awards in the categories above will receive a glass award, which is distributed at the award ceremony on Sunday afternoon.
